Up and running

All four partner cities now on the air at **North Texas Emergency Communications Center**

CARROLLTON ~ After years of planning, preparation, testing and checking, the North Texas Emergency Communications Center, or NTECC, is now fully implemented with public safety dispatch for its four member cities - Farmers Branch, Carrollton, Coppell and Addison.

In February, Farmers Branch was first to move their public safety dispatch capabilities to the centralized, state-of-the-art facility, located near Interstate 35E in

Carrollton. All four cities were live on

the system by the end of March.

Farmers Branch Fire Chief Steve Parker explained that NTECC is not the first combined dispatch center in north Texas, but it is the largest and live" of Farmers Branch emergency communications. most elaborate. "This represents a huge commit-

ment on the part of these four cities," he said. "It has been a project of enormous proportions."

Early Voting runs thru May 3; Election Day is May 7

FARMERS BRANCH ~ Early voting will continue as April gives way to May, heading for Election Day on Saturday, May 7.

Two City Council Districts are up for election this year. In District 1, Ana Reyes is running unopposed. In District 4, Chuck Zubarik and Terry Lynne are candidates.

Early voting begins Monday through Saturday, April 25-30, from 8 a.m. until 5 p.m. It continues on Sunday, May 1, from 1 until 6 p.m. Then, early voting concludes Monday and Tuesday, May 2 & 3, from 7 a.m. until 7 p.m. Any Dallas County voter can vote early at any Dallas County early voting location, including Farmers Branch City Hall.

On Election Day, Saturday, May 7, voters must cast their ballots at their designated precinct polling place. Find out more about that at dallascountyvotes.org or farmersbranchbc.gov/elections.

The Marshals will handle duties previously done by police officers, thus freeing up officers for the street. Among their work will be to serve and process the more than 18,000 active warrants outstanding in the municipal court.

Screening necessary for outdoor storage of recycling cart

FBTX ~ With the new Curbside Recycling Program now underway, residents are reminded to store their recycling cart out of view of the street.

Participating residents received carts in March prior to the start of the program the week of April 4.

Storage of the 95-gallon rolling cart can be in a garage or inside a backyard

FARMERS BRANCH with solid RECYCLES fencing.

For those that, for whatever reason, cannot store a cart in the garage or backyard, they may store the cart next to the house provided that carts are screened in with opaque fencing in an L-shaped configuration.

There will be a grace period until October 1 for installation of proper screening.

Fines for solid waste ordinance violations will range up to \$500. However, City officials emphasize that residents will have ample opportunity to learn about proper storage and correct any issues.
