Starting at the intersection of I-35E and Valley View, the tour continues down Den-



ton Drive, now featuring animation synced to music, to the Farmers Branch Historical Park where 'Winter Wonderland' will be presented in a bigger-than-ever show will have more twinkling lights, holiday music and Christmas displays.

The 500,000 lights along the tour will be on each evening from November 25 through December 30, with the Historical Park

Most City offices remain closed on Friday, November 25 with the exception of: the Farmers Branch Community Recreation Center and Margaret Young Natatorium, both open from 6 a.m. to 5 p.m., and the Farmers Branch Historical Park, open 8 a.m. until 5 p.m.

Early voting dates defined for national election

FBTX~ Registered voters may vote early for the November 8 national election at any Dallas county early voting location, including Farmers Branch City Hall.

Early voting will take place Monday, thru Saturday, October 24 to 29 from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.; Sunday, October 30 from 1 until 6 p.m.; and Monday thru Friday, October 31 to November 4 from 7 a.m. til 7 p.m.

On Election Day, Tuesday, November 8, voters must cast ballots at their designated polling place.

He holds a bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice from the University of Texas at San Antonio and a master's degree in Behavioral Studies from Southern Methodist University. Additionally, Deputy Chief Habel is a graduate of the FBI National Academy (2011), the Bill Blackwood Law Enforcement Management Institute of Texas (2005) and the Institute for Law Enforcement Administration at the Center for American and International Law (2005).

Lieutenant Jimmy Lee first joined the Farmers Branch Police Department in 1996 following five years of police service in Royse City. He was promoted to Corporal in 2001 and Sergeant in 2007. Lieutenant Lee is currently the Intoxylizer program coordinator, video system coor-

dinator, fitness instructor and a member of the hiring board.

He is also a graduate of the Bill Blackwood Law Enforcement Management Institute of Texas and the Institute for Law Enforcement Administration at the Center for American and International Law. For any other national holidays, appropriate decorations may be displayed beginning two weeks prior to the holiday and must be removed by the first Monday

following the holiday.

Code Enforcement staff reminds residents that blue recycling containers must now be stored out of sight from the street - either in a fenced back yard, inside a garage or behind a screening fence if stored beside the house. Code Enforcement has provided a helpful video tutorial of how to construct a simple screening fence at youtube.com/fbtv16.
